The Air Force Language Enabled Airman Program (LEAP)

LEAP is managed by the Air Force Culture and Language Center. It pays Airmen for their language skills and its mission is to develop cross-culturally competent leaders who can meet Air Force global mission requirements.

The U.S. Air Force encourages all airmen to become proficient in a foreign language. LEAP is a volunteer program open to Active-Duty officers and enlisted Airmen in most careers.

LEAP selects willing and able Airmen and Guardians who exhibit demonstrated ability and commitment, develops and sustains Language Regional Expertise and Culture skills over the course of a career, and postures them for utilization in assignments, contingencies, and deployments.

Benefits of LEAP:

- Develop / Maintain Your Language, Regional Expertise and Culture.

 Being part of LEAP distinguishes service members within their career field and opens doors to serving as a Foreign Area Officer (FAO), supporting missions, serving as an Air Force Office of Special Investigation (AFOSI) agent, teaching at an international school such as the Inter-American Air Forces Academy (IAAFA), etc.
- Earn the LEAP Special Experience Identifier
 (SEI). LEAP scholars who attain the required
 level of proficiency and experience are awarded
 the LEAP Special Experience Identifier (SEI),
 which is used by force managers to identify
 qualified service members for assignments and
 other opportunities. In addition, LEAP SEI is
 used to qualify members for Foreign Language
 Proficiency Bonus (FLPB) pay. For more
