Applications Due: Admission is considered rolling. However, applications will be clustered for interviews at the end of October and of January, and as needed afterward.

Applying: A minimum GPA of 3.0 in last 60 hours is required (may provisionally consider lower). Prospective students apply to the non-thesis program online through the **Graduate School.** Additional items are submitted directly to the School of Education. Eligible applicants will be scheduled for an interview. The Elementary Education program offers two regular options and requires that applicants note their option at the time of application. Both options begin Summer II, lead to the same degree, and require the same coursework. Completing the program in 12 months, instead of 10, does not delay your degree/license, nor does it prevent you from applying for jobs to begin in the upcoming fall.

- Option 1 is a full-time **twelve-month** program for students who need to complete EDCI 5554 (Exceptional Learners) and EDEP 5154 (Ed Psych for Teachers). These **must be** completed in Summer I prior to the start of the program in Summer II or they can be taken in Summer I after completing the program.
- Option 2 is a full-time **ten-month** program that begins in Summer II, and for students who have completed both EDCI 5554 and EDEP 5154. **Dual/Accelerated status is NOT required for this option.**
