

MAKING GLOBAL CONNECTIONS FOR STUDENT LEARNING JUNE 1-7, 2025; COPENHAGEN, DENMARK

The College of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences (CLAHS), Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning (CETL), and Global Education Office (GEO) are coordinating a cohort-based workshop for CLAHS faculty. In partnership with <u>DIS Study Abroad in Scandinavia</u> (Copenhagen, Denmark), this workshop will provide strategies for integrating global themes and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) into teaching and learning as well as research. Participants must be willing to commit to attending the workshop in Copenhagen from June 1-June 7, 2025, participate in pre-workshop and post-workshop activities, and produce a deliverable as an outcome of the experience. Workshop facilitators will include DIS staff/faculty as well as Dr. Farida Jalalzai (CLAHS OOD, Global Initiatives and Engagement), Dr. Tiffany Shoop (CETL), and Natalie Larsen (GEO).

The focus of this place-based workshop emphasizes three SDGs that make the DIS Study Abroad location in Copenhagen particularly fitting: Sustainable Cities and Communities (SDG 11), Gender Equality (SDG 5), and Climate Action (SDG 13).



ELIGIBILITY

Full time CLAHS faculty on continuing contracts: tenuretrack, tenured, collegiate, instructors, lecturers, professors of practice, clinical faculty, and research professors.





COSTS

\$2,800 program fee + airfare (+travel to/from the airport, telecommunications, \$200 in meals, passport, etc.). The College of Liberal Arts and Human Sciences Office will match up to \$1,500 of funds secured by the applicant to support faculty travel.
